

NOTIFICATION OF A SCHEME

Professional Standards Act 2004 (SA)

The Law Society of South Australia Professional Standards Scheme

Notification is hereby given pursuant to Section 9 of the *Professional Standards Act 2004* (SA) of a Scheme prepared by the Law Society of South Australia of Level 10, 178 North Terrace, Adelaide SA 5000.

The Scheme will apply to all admitted and company members who hold a current Practising Certificate with the Law Society.

The Scheme:

- limits the occupational liability of members of the Law Society to whom the Scheme applies to either \$1,500,000
 or \$10,000,000, depending on the annual fee income generated for the financial year immediately preceding
 the act or omission that gave rise to the occupational liability
- provides for a member to apply for a higher maximum amount of liability, not exceeding \$50,000,000, than would otherwise apply under the Scheme
- provides for a member to apply for an exemption from the Scheme
- requires that members to whom the Scheme applies have insurance for occupational liability of an amount not less than the amount of their limited liability.

Note that the discretion to approve a higher amount of liability, or an exemption from the Scheme, is with the Law Society. The Law Society requires that members to whom the Scheme applies comply with relevant risk management strategies.

The Scheme may commence on 1 July 2022, after publication in the South Australian Government Gazette, if approved by the Professional Standards Councils. The Scheme is intended to remain in force from its date of commencement in South Australia for five years and, under the mutual recognition provisions of the Act, in the Australian Capital Territory, New South Wales, the Northern Territory, Queensland, Victoria, Tasmania, and Western Australia.

A copy of the Scheme may be obtained from, or inspected at, the office or website of the Professional Standards Councils. Before approving the Scheme, the Professional Standards Council of South Australia hereby invites comments and submissions to be made in writing and received by the Chief Executive Officer, Professional Standards Councils, within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
